Mark K. Hauserman is a native of Cleveland, Ohio. He graduated from Portsmouth Abbey School in Portsmouth, Rhode Island. He received his undergraduate degree in Business Administration from John Carroll University. Upon graduation, he accepted a commission in the United States Army and served in Virginia, Missouri, the Republic of Vietnam, and Germany.

After returning from overseas, he entered the MBA program at Indiana University. He is a Beta Gamma Sigma honor graduate of that program.

Mr. Hauserman joined his family's business, the E.F. Hauserman Company, in 1974 as a member of the Corporate Financial Staff. After transferring to Sales, he held a series of positions of increasing responsibility in both Sales and Sales Management, working in Atlanta, GA; Rochester, NY; and Cleveland, OH. In 1984, he bought a subsidiary, Decorative Veneer, from the Company.

In the 1980's and 1990's, he helped to develop a diverse group of smaller companies in Information Management, Consumer Marketing, Office Furniture and Coating Technologies, by assembling the management teams, providing strategic direction, and capital. He divested his ownership of these companies over the past five years. In October of 2004, he became the Director of the Entrepreneurs Association at John Carroll University. In 2006, he became the Director of the Muldoon Center for Entrepreneurship at John Carroll.

Mr. Hauserman serves on a number of Boards of Private Companies in addition to his own companies, and has been active in a number of Professional Organizations, including as a Board Member of the Northeast Ohio Student Venture Fund.

Mr. Hauserman has also been very active in his community. He is the past Chair of the Board of Trustees of Ursuline College, the Center for Community Solutions and Vocational Guidance Services. He was the head of the Allocations Division of United Way Services of Cleveland and was a member of the Boards of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Cleveland, Portsmouth Abbey School, the Ronald McDonald House of Cleveland, the United Way of Cleveland, and the Alumni Board of John Carroll University. He is a member of the Leadership Cleveland Class of 1988 and served on the Alumni steering Committee.

Mr. Hauserman and his wife Andrea have two adopted two children, a brother and sister from The Republic of Kazakhstan. John, age 14, is in the 7th Grade and Sarah, age 13, is in 6th Grade.
